#### **VVA # 278 ACTIVITIES**

VVA # 278 had several members recognized by the Daughters of the American Revolution in Atlanta for their service during the Vietnam War. We set-up at the Boy Scout Scout-a-Rama where we passed out veteran related information, worked on our fundraising projects, and let the scouts put on our flak jackets, helmets, etc. and take their picture. We set up 2 days at Wadley Hospital in their Salute to Veterans with information and Vietnam memorabilia. We set up at the annual Texarkana RailFest distributing information and working on our fundraiser. We held our 21<sup>st</sup> annual "Veterans Information Fair" where we had over 20 different agencies with programs for veterans. We had over 70 veterans and/or their families come in. We would like to thank all the different agencies and a big thanks to the Elks Lodge # 2771 for allowing us to have it at their lodge!!! The Elks also furnished lunch for all the vendors and they furnished a free breakfast for the veterans as they do every third Saturday! We were honored to present the Elks # 2771 with the VVA Texas State Council's annual "Friend of VVA" award at this Fair! At our May meeting we approved a \$500 scholarship for a grandson of a Vietnam veteran. We will have at least two more scholarship applications come in. We were proud to award Raymond Calhoun with the Texas State Council "Boot Award" for his work with VVA # 278! We hosted our 34<sup>th</sup> Memorial Day service where we read the names of those on our Korea/Vietnam Memorial which were killed 50 years ago in 1967. We also read the name of Earnest Leroy Garner, the name we just added plus the five names which their status was updated. His wife was present and we presented her with a Gold Star pin and the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary pin. We would like to thank Memorial Arts for adding this name and doing the updates and adding the names to the Police Officers Memorial VVA # 278 built! We also read these recently added names at our Memorial Day Service! We also participated in the Texarkana Area Veterans Council's Memorial Day Service and attended two others, some made three others.

PRISONERS OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION (POW/MIA)

AMERICANS ACCOUNTED FOR: The number of US personnel missing and unaccounted-for from the Vietnam War is still 1,611. The total accounted for since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975 is 972. Another 63 US personnel, recovered by the US and identified before the end of the war, bring the total of US personnel accounted for from the Vietnam War to 1,035. There follows a breakdown by country of the 972 Americans accounted for since the April 30, 1975 end of the Vietnam War: Vietnam, 661; Laos, 268, Cambodia, 41 and the PRC, 3. Of the 1,611 still missing (POW/MIA) and unaccounted-for (KIA/BNR), 90% were lost in Vietnam or in areas of Cambodia and Laos under Vietnam's wartime control: Vietnam-1,258 (VN-463, VS-795); Laos-297; Cambodia-49; PRC territorial waters-7. These country-specific numbers can and do fluctuate when investigations result in changes to loss locations. Of these 1611, 15 are from Arkansas; 24 are from Louisiana; 32 are from Oklahoma; and 102 are from Texas.

There are still 126 Americans unaccounted for from the Cold War: 2 from AR; 1 from LA; 3 from OK; and 4 from Texas. There are still 7,751 Americans unaccounted for from the Korean War: 102 from AR; 147 from LA; 146 from OK; 432 from TX. There are still 73,061 Americans unaccounted for from World War II; 852 from AR; 984 from LA; 1235 from Ok; 3660 from TX. Iraq Theater & Other Conflicts – 6 Americans unaccounted for.

## VA's Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry

Registry for Veterans and Servicemembers

VA's Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry allows eligible Veterans and Servicemembers to document their exposures and report health concerns through an online questionnaire.

Eligible Veterans and Servicemembers include those who served in:

- •Operation Enduring Freedom/Operation Iraqi Freedom/Operation New Dawn
  - Djibouti, Africa on or after September 11, 2001
  - Operations Desert Shield and/or Desert Storm
  - •Southwest Asia theater of operations on or after August 2, 1990

In total, 106,937 Veterans and Servicemembers completed and submitted the registry questionnaire between April 25, 2014 and May 1, 2017. For more information go to:

## **TEXARKANA CVEB (COMMUNITY VETERANS ENGAGEMENT BOARD)**

We have recently formed a CVEB in Texarkana, under the umbrella of the one at Overton Brooks in Shreveport. We have outlined four issues that we can see needs action ASAP:

1. Fast tracking claims.

2. Establishing a local Veterans Court.

- 3. Homeless Veterans.
- 4. Getting information to Veterans and their families.

Plus we are working on a Resource list/combining what is already available.

This list could and very possibly will grow as will the size of the CVEB but we decided to do it slowly. Right now attendance to the CVEB is by invitation only but if you have any ideas we are open to suggestions and ideas.

## **Veterans Legislation Clears the House and Senate:**

The House and Senate passed several bills this week which would help veterans. The House provisions include a reform to the burdensome process veterans must use to appeal a disability rating decision. This reform passed unanimously 418-0. Additional House legislation would improve requirements for scheduling appointments to help ensure that hidden appointment lists do not happen again; more support for veterans needing adult day care; and an annual cost-of-living adjustment for veterans equal to what is given to Social Security recipients if such an increase is granted this year. Three bills on the Senate side passed unanimously this week. The first is a bill which requires the reduction of the federal annuities of individuals removed from the Department of Veterans Affairs Senior Executive Service if they are convicted of a felony; legislation that would require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to submit an annual report regarding performance awards and bonuses for certain high-level employees.
